SESSION 3

HOW TO SHARE THE GOSPEL

(60 MINUTES)

**Successful evangelism is taking the

This training is meant to help us be more interactive in our gospel-sharing. People we talk to about Jesus have different ideas and understanding about God and what the Bible teaches about salvation, eternal life, etc.. They also like to be listened to, and not just listen to us do all the talking while we share about Jesus Christ.

Aside from more interaction with our evangelistic contacts, this training will also help us clarify important points about the gospel with them.

I. Introducing the One Minute Witness

A. Be available – Pray

Dear Jesus,

Fill me with the Holy Spirit. I am available. Please provide me an opportunity to share my story today, and to share the gospel.

B. Be prepared

“Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.”

1 Peter 3:15

II. Introducing God’s Way to Heaven

A. On pages with verses

ASK: “What do you think this verse means?” with some of the verses you ask them to read.

B. Page 3: Romans 6:23

READ: Romans 6:23 says, “For the wages of sin is death...”

SAY: “Do you know what the Tagalog word for “wages” is?”

(*Note: They usually answer, “sweldo” or they don’t know the Tagalog word.)

The word wages can be translated “kabayaran,” in other words, just like a worker deserves the wages he receives, we get what we deserve, so if we translate the verse, it reads: “Ang kabayaran ng kasalanan ay kamatayan.”

(*Note: This drives the point closer to their hearts, because they hear it in our language.)

C. Page 4: Revelation 21:8

READ: “The cowardly, the unbelieving, the vile, the murderers, the sexually immoral, those who practice magic arts, the idolaters and all liars— their place will be in the fiery lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death.” (Revelation 21:8)

SAY: “After reading this verse, I might say that I am not a murderer, or have been sexually immoral, but it also says here, “all liars”, and I know that I have lied more than once in my life. This verse says that you and I qualify for the second death as well.

D. Page 7: Ephesians 2:8–10

READ: “For it is by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not of yourselves. It is the gift of God, not as a result of works, that no one should boast.” (Ephesians 2:8–9)

ASK: “According to this verse, how are we saved?”
(*Note: Listen to and acknowledge their answers.)

SAY: “This verse tells us that we are saved by grace, through faith and not by doing good works.”

E. Page 9: Revelation 3:20

READ: “Here I am, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him and he with me.” (Revelations 3:20)

SAY: “Jesus is the one speaking here. What do you think the door represents?” (Let person answer)

ANSWER: “The door represents our hearts or our lives.”

ASK: “According to this verse, what will Jesus do if you open the door of your heart to Him?”

F. Page 11: THE ACCEPTANCE PRAYER

Read the prayer to the person first.

ASK: “Does this prayer express the desire of your heart?”

YES!

***NOTE: If your contact answers, “YES”**

ASK: Why would you want to accept Jesus into your heart as Savior and Lord?

*(*Note: Listen to the person’s answers, you will be amazed at how ready many people are in accepting Jesus into their lives! Proceed to leading the person in the prayer of acceptance. Pray the prayer **phrase by phrase**, aloud. Repeat the phrases twice in your mind, this will help you pace how you lead the person in prayer.)*

NO!

***NOTE: If your contact answers “NO,” or “NOT READY”**

ASK: May I ask why?

*(*Note: Listen closely to your contact’s answer. It may be that there’s a previous point or verse that you shared that wasn’t clear to him/her. If so, clarify that point, but if that’s not the case...)*

SAY: “Thanks for being honest! May I continue sharing with you some of the things that will happen to your life if you receive Christ?”

*(*Note: If your contact gives you permission, proceed to page 14 and read all the points there, putting them in the FUTURE tense.)*
Example: “You WILL be 100% forgiven...”; “You WILL be part of God’s family...”

AFTER YOU GO THROUGH pages 12-13

ASK: “Now that you know these things, would you like to accept Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord?”

*(*Note: If your contact says, “Yes” Go back to page 13 and lead the person through the prayer. Then read page 14 again, this time going through some of the verses mentioned there.)*

**Note: If your contact says, “No” or “Not ready”*

SAY: “Thank you for your honesty, I would like to give this booklet to you, and maybe someday you would want to accept Jesus into your life as Savior and Lord. Thank you for your time! I appreciate you for listening to me, and for sharing your insights with me.”

SESSION 4

(30 MINUTES)

I. Follow Up

Immediate, intentional action taken to make the most of the present opportunity.

*Be very careful, then, how you live--not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil.

What follow-up tool do we recommend?

BOOK 1: ONE BY ONE

What is One By One?

- A basic follow-up material to start the new believer's spiritual journey
- An interactive material that encourages new believers to discover and learn from the Bible for themselves
- A simple way to begin a Dgroup (start with one or two, let them invite others)
- **Mindset:** One By One is part of a journey, not just a material to go through
- **Focus:** Discover and apply the Bible
- **Key skill:** Ask questions
- **Goal:** Not to finish the material, but to help the new believer(s) grow

B. Asking The Right Questions

- The key to effective questioning is knowing how to ask the RIGHT questions. Never tell when you can ASK! They will most likely remember what they said rather than what you said.
- Easiest rule to remember in promoting good discussions: never ask questions that can be answered with a yes or no.
- By asking questions, you allow your members to discover biblical truths for themselves.

- c. REDIRECTION Questions

 - If I heard you right, you are saying...?
